

HISTORIC PRESERVATION – SECTION 106 PROCESS

- DDOT is identifying historic properties within the APE:
 - DDOT has identified 154 historic properties within the APE, including those listed on or eligible for the National Register of Historic Places
 - An additional 23 buildings, structures, and objects greater than 50 years old within the APE are being evaluated for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places
- DDOT has begun assessing the effects of the streetcar project on these historic properties
- DDOT is completing this Process through on-going consultation with the District of Columbia State Historic Preservation Office (DC SHPO) and other consulting parties. To date, three Consulting Party meetings have been held, with at least one more planned before the completion of the NEPA document



Area of Potential Effect (APE) is the geographic area within which an undertaking may directly or indirectly cause alterations in the character or use of historic properties
